- 3. Research/Evidence (how you comprehend, utilize, and incorporate researched ideas into your own writing)
- 4. Utilizing Technology (learning new ways to utilize technology, such as organizing files, digital collaboration using Google Docs, Chat, or other)
- 5. Abstract thinking (how you use symbols, images, descriptions to convey ideas with art or writing)
- 6. Drafting Process (How have you developed through your own brainstorming, drafting, editing process)
- 7. Writing Grammar and Mechanics
- 8. Writing Style (smooth and natural transitions, flow, and use of description and imagery)
- 9. Writing Voice (your writing sounds like "you," clearly expresses original thinking)
- 10. Language (professional language and diction choice)
- 11. Reading Skills (comprehension of text, critical reflection on text)
- 12. Collaboration (taking on a role in a group, working with others, listening and sharing ideas)
- 13. Empathy/Perspectives (understanding from different points of view, empathizing with someone in your group, history, literature, or the modern world)
- 14. Executive Skills (planning, prioritizing, time management, organization, reflecting on the day)
